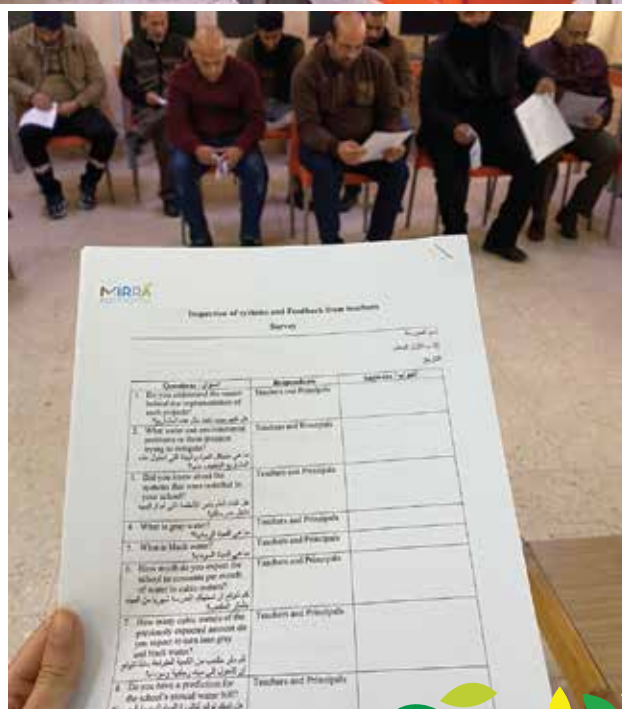

Capacity Building Programs



One of MIRRA's services is to design and execute processes for developing and strengthening the skills, instincts, abilities, and resources that individuals, organizations and communities need to survive, adapt, and thrive in a fast-changing world.





MIRRA's Capacity Building Approach



Our approach involves six steps which are: conducting training needs assessment, identifying and engaging stakeholders on capacity development, assessing capacity needs and assets, formulating a capacity development response, implementing a capacity development response, and evaluating capacity development.





Herein, we show pictures from our capacity building programs for school teachers and Syrian refugees on the methods and benefits of greywater treatment and reuse within schools and households; and for vulnerable Jordanian communities in southern Jordan on best practices for greenhouse agriculture.

What is Cash for Work?

Cash-for-Work programs create earning opportunities that can temporarily stabilize people's incomes following a disaster or a crisis. The principle is simple: people work and receive pay. Cash-for-Work schemes can be regarded as a means of bolstering social safety nets and are intended to alleviate the strain of an ongoing crisis.



Who does Cash for Work help and how?

Cash-for-Work programs in the context of refugee aid are geared primarily to the most vulnerable refugees and also to poorer members of the host communities who are unable to find alternative forms of employment on the local job market. People who have had no opportunity to work, sometimes for longer periods of time, get a chance to earn some income again and develop a feeling of solidarity by contributing to the welfare of the community.



What are MIRRA's Cash for Work programs?

During 2023, our cash for work activities involved helping to set up a community garden in the town of Rehab within the Mafraq governorate in the north eastern part of Jordan; installing drip irrigation systems within two public parks in the governorate of Mafraq, and setting up a greenhouse in the town of Quwayrah in south Jordan.
